



LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT



KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that I, G. P. COOK, a resident of Madison County, Mississippi, above the age of twenty-one years and of sound, disposing mind and memory, hereby make, publish and declare this my Last Will and Testament, hereby specifically revoking any and all other instruments of like nature and codicils thereto, heretofore made or purporting to have been made, by me.

ITEM I.

I have made different gifts to my beloved wife, Florence N. Cook, from time to time, as have others, which she can designate. I mention this only to make certain all such gifts shall be excluded from my estate.

ITEM II.

To her I bequeath the sum of \$40,000.00 in cash or Certificates of Deposit; any and all interest I may have in such gifts as have been made to us jointly through the years; the following furniture in our residence: Breakfast Room table and chairs, one Living Room end table, two Living Room lamp tables and the lamps thereon; and the following articles: Silver Set and Dining Room table cloth.

ITEM III.

I consider the above bequests to be a fair share of my estate and adequate to take care of her comfortably for the remainder of her life. But, without any limitation or restriction on those bequests, I hope however it will be her pleasure to bequeath one-half of what is left of this bequest to her sister Helen, if living, and divide the other half equally among her two brothers, Howard and Ben, and my three sons, Gilbert, Jr., William Lewis and Woodrow Edsel.

I mention my three sons in this connection because of the uncertainty of what may develop in the business world before they have disposed of the net realty which they will receive under ITEM IX hereinafter.

ITEM IV.

To each of my ten Grandchildren of the first generation, Gilbert Lewis Cook, Peggy C. Morvant, Roger Cook; Norma Lynn Hartwig, Kathy Cook, William L. Cook, Jr., and Douglas Gilbert Cook; and Beckie Cook, Walter Edsel Cook and Daniel Cook, I bequeath \$1,000.00 each. Those of said Grandchildren who have attained their majority or are as much as 18 years old and married at the time of my death may receive their

respective bequests promptly. The bequests to those then under 21 years of age and not married may be paid to Guardians or placed in Trust Deposits, as may be determined by the Court.

ITEM V.

To my Daughters-in-Law Virginia W. Cook, Ruth R. Cook and Annie Ruth Cook, I bequeath all household furniture remaining after that bequeathed to my wife, such items to be allotted to each in shares to be as nearly equal as possible according to value, between the three families. This involves their own needs and the needs of their children. In any question arising in making such division, the decision of any two mothers shall control, though the three sons might be helpful in determining the values of different items.

ITEM VI.

To my brother, Holoman Cook, and my sisters, Earl C. Hastings, Lena May Brignac and Launo C. Hannah, I bequeath \$1,000.00 each, provided if any one of them shall have predeceased me, the bequest to him or her shall go to the child or children of such decedent, and if there should be no child or children, shall go to the estate of the decedent.

ITEM VII.

I bequeath to Martha Moody Brignac, daughter of my deceased sister, Bell C. Moody, \$500.00.

ITEM VIII.

The residue of my estate consisting principally of the remaining acres in the Subdivision, the 165-acre farm left on Bear Creek, the "Taylor Place" (farm) near Vaughan, the one-half interest in realty at Meridian joint with Edsel, the Apartment House on Academy Street in Canton, the Residence on 16 Highway East, and the small investment in Co-operative Stocks and notes, after the satisfaction of the foregoing bequests and the administration of my estate, I devise and bequeath, share and share alike, to my three sons, Gilbert P. Cook, Jr., William Lewis Cook and Woodrow Edsel Cook. Should any of my said sons have predeceased me, his share shall go to his heirs-at-law. 



(b) I hereby constitute and appoint as Trustees of any and all trusts created under this Will my sons, ALVIN W. LEVY and LOUIS K. LEVY. If for any reason ALVIN W. LEVY or LOUIS K. LEVY should fail to qualify or should cease or be unable to serve in this capacity hereunder, then I constitute and appoint as Trustee

the other to serve as sole Trustee. If both ALVIN W. LEVY and LOUIS K. LEVY should fail to qualify or should cease or be unable to serve in this capacity hereunder, then I constitute and appoint as Trustee my grandson, BERTRAM L. LEVY.

(c) No successor Executor or Trustee shall be required to inquire into or audit the acts or doings of any predecessor Executor or Trustee or make any claim against such predecessor Executor or Trustee or his or her estate.

(d) Any successor Executor or Trustee shall have and may exercise any or all of the powers herein conferred on my Executor or Trustee as fully and to the same extent as if such successor had originally been named as Executor or Trustee herein.

(e) Singular forms of the words "Trustee", "Executor" and "Executrix" used herein shall include their plural forms if more than one fiduciary is serving. Plural forms of the word "Trustee" used herein shall include its singular form if only one fiduciary is serving. Similarly, pronouns shall be deemed to include masculine, feminine, or neuter forms in order to reflect the gender of the fiduciary then serving.

ITEM THREE

All my household furniture and furnishings, books, pictures, objects of art, silverware, jewelry, clothing and other such personal effects and any automobiles I may own at the time of my death, I give and bequeath to my Executor to distribute in such a manner as he in his sole discretion may decide. If I have left with my personal papers or with my Executor a list of certain specific items of personal property which I would like for certain named persons to have at my death, it is my wish (but not my direction), that my Executor will honor my wishes.

ITEM FOUR

(a) I give, devise, and bequeath to the Trustees named above as Trustees the following property:

- (1) \$15,000 Virginia Electric Light and Power Company 9% Bond;
