FIRST - I give, bequeath and devise unto Lula Bracy, my wife, the following described property lying, being and situated in Madison County, Mississippi, to-wit: The SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 22, Township 8, Range 2 East.

I, Carl A. Hallgren of the City of Rock Island, County of Rock Island and State of Illinois, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do hereby publish and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament, in the words and figures following:

FIRST:- I direct that my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid out of my estate by my executrix hereinafter named, or in the manner hereinafter provided.

SECOND:- I give and devise to my wife, Jessie M. Hallgren, of Rock Island, Illinois, my residence or homestead property, on which we now reside, at 2540-19th Avenue, Rock Island, Illinois, viz: the east forty feet of Lot 20 and all of Lot 21 in W. E. Bailey's Woodlawn Addition in South Rock Island Township, now annexed to and being a part of the City of Rock Island, in the County of Rock Island and State of Illinois; subject, however, to a mortgage thereon to the Rock Island Bank and Trust Company to secure a note in the principal sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00), dated February 1, 1934, and which mortgage is recorded in Book 203 of Mortgages, on page 437 thereof, in the Recorder's office of said Rock Island County; and I direct that my said wife shall pay two notes, including principal and interest, which I now owe to said Rock Island Bank and Trust Company, (or any renewals thereof), out of the proceeds of the policies of insurance on my life to which she will, as beneficiary, personally become entitled upon my death, which two notes are described as follows, viz: A note for Fifteen Thousand Four Hundred Forty Three and 40/100 Dollars (\$15,443.40) of principal, dated January 3, 1937, and a note for Two Thousand Six Hundred Nine and 40/100 Dollars (\$2,609.40) of principal, dated January 3, 1937, both payable to said Rock Island Bank and Trust Company, and for the payment of which, said mortgage

and note for Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) above described, are held by said bank as part of the collateral security therefor, to the end and effect that said mortgage be released and all said notes be cancelled, as paid, and that the stocks, or other securities which I have also pledged, or may pledge, to said Rock Island Bank and Trust Company to secure said debts owed it, may be released and delivered to my executrix and shall be a part of my residuary estate hereinafter devised and bequeathed, unincumbered by said debts owed Rock Island Bank and Trust Company, and that title to said real estate shall be vested in my said wife in fee, free of incumbrances.

THIRD:- I give and bequeath to my said wife, Jessie M. Hallgren, all my household goods, silver, furnishings, and other personal property contained in my above described residence, and also any automobiles which I may own at the time of my death, for her own use and benefit, excluding from this bequest, however, any stocks, bonds, notes, contracts, or other intangible assets.

FOURTH:- I give, devise and bequeath all the rest, residue, and remainder of my property, real, personal, and mixed, and wheresoever situate, which I may own or to which I may in any way be entitled at the time of my death, to my wife, said Jessie M. Hallgren, in trust, nevertheless, for the following uses and purposes, viz:

- (a) To collect, receive, and hold said trust property in its original, changed, or re-invested form, and to collect and receive the income therefrom, pay all expenses and charges in connection with the administration of the trust, and to distribute or apply the net income therefrom as hereinafter provided.

During the administration of my estate my executrix, hereinafter appointed, may pay over to said trustee the income from my said residuary estate, to be treated as trust income.

- (b) Said trustee shall have full power and authority to sell and convert said trust property, or any part thereof, into money from time to time and to receive as trustee the proceeds of such sale or sales

and her sale, conveyance, or transfer of any part of the trust property shall invest the purchaser or purchasers thereof with a good and indefeasible title therein, without any obligation on the part of the purchaser or purchasers to look to the application of the purchase money; and said trustee may compound, settle, or compromise any claims or rights of the trust or arising out of or relating to the trust property.

- (c) Said trustee shall have full power and authority to invest and reinvest the trust property from time to time in such securities or investments as she in her discretion may deem best, but I recommend to her that she make investments in only such securities as are or may be authorized by the laws of Illinois for the investment of trust funds, and that she make no investments without first obtaining competent, disinterested advice, to the end that the said trust property may yield such income as is consistent with safety and prudent investment, but said trustee is authorized to retain in whole or in part any investment which I may have made in my life-time and which may remain in my estate, upon my death.
- (d) This trust shall be for the equal use and benefit of my said wife, Jessie M. Hallgren, and my children, namely: Virginia Hallgren, Shirley Hallgren, and Beverly Hallgren, except as hereinafter provided.
- (e) It is my desire but not my direction that my said wife and my said daughters live together in our present home or some other home until my daughters are married, or so long as practicable and they desire to do so, and that while they, or any of them, so live together, the expenses and maintenance of such home, exclusive of taxes, insurance, and repairs on the house, but including the rent (if any), food, light, heat, wages, and other current expenses common to the household, shall be shared equally by my said wife and those of my said daughters who may be living in such home, and such expenses may be paid by said trustee out of said net income before distributing the balance, if any, of the net income, and the proper portion of such expenses shall be allocated and charged to each share of net income. Individual expenses, such as clothing, education, medical expense, or the like, shall be paid by or from the share of the net income of the individual for whose benefit such expense was incurred.

During such period or periods as any of my said daughters shall live or reside elsewhere than in such home, the share of the net income of such daughter or daughters shall be

paid to such daughter or daughters without deduction for the home expenses above provided for, and such payments shall be made at convenient intervals but at least annually; provided, however, that if any of such daughters be a minor during such period or periods her share of said net income may be applied directly by said trustee for the support and maintenance of said minor.

Any balance of such net income remaining after the payment of expenses or distributions above allocated or provided for shall be paid to my said wife and daughters entitled thereto, taking into account in arriving at such balance and shares the proper charges and payments above provided for; such balance to be distributed at convenient intervals, but at least annually.

The share in such balance or in such distributions above provided for of any of my daughters who are or may arrive at legal age shall be paid to her personally, but during the minority of any of my said daughters the said trustee may hold the same, or pay the same to, or use the same for the benefit of said minor until such minor arrives at legal age.

(f) In the event of the marriage of any of my said three daughters prior to the final termination of the trust herein created, such married daughter of mine shall thereupon become entitled to and shall receive her share of the principal of the trust property and any net income to which she may be entitled, as and for her own property; the same to be paid to her within one year after her marriage, or sooner if practicable; and the trust as to such married daughter shall thereupon be terminated and she shall have no further interest therein (except as provided in part 2 of section (g) following) but the balance of the trust property shall remain in the trust.

(g) This trust shall be finally terminated by any of the following events:

1. If my widow, Jessie M. Hallgren, remarries the trust shall then terminate and she shall receive her share of the principal of the trust property and any income to which she may be entitled, as and for her own property; and those of my said daughters who have not already received their respective shares shall be entitled to and shall receive their respective shares of the principal and income of the trust property to which they may be entitled, as and for their own property; provided, however, that the issue of any daughter of mine then deceased shall receive the share to which its parent would have been

entitled if living.

2. In the event of the death of my said widow, Jessie M. Hallgren, before the trust is otherwise terminated by the terms of this will then the trust shall terminate and the principal of the trust property and any accrued net income (minus the share of principal and net income to which my deceased wife would have been entitled if she had lived until the trust had otherwise terminated under the provisions of this will) shall be divided between those of my said daughters who have not already received their respective shares; provided, however, that the issue of any deceased daughter of mine shall take the share to which its parent would have been entitled if living; and further, that the share in such principal and interest of such trust property which my said wife would have taken if she had lived, as aforesaid, shall be divided equally between my said three daughters, the issue of any deceased daughter of mine to take the share of its deceased parent.
 3. Twenty-one years after the date of the birth of my youngest daughter, Beverly Hallgren, this trust, unless sooner terminated under the provisions of this will, shall terminate, and my wife, if living, shall receive her share of the principal of the trust property as and for her own property, and the balance of the trust property shall be divided equally between those of my said three daughters who shall not have previously received their respective shares, and if any of my said daughters are then deceased the issue of such deceased daughter shall take its parent's share.
 4. Provided, further, however, that if any of my said daughters die without issue before the final termination of this trust then my surviving daughters, and the issue of any daughter who may be deceased prior thereto, shall succeed to the share of such deceased daughter of mine under this trust, such issue (if any) to take its parent's share.
- (h) Said trustee shall pay or transfer the share of each respective beneficiary under this trust (not used or applied to such beneficiary's respective use by the trustee as hereinabove provided) only to such beneficiary in person, and shall not pay or transfer any part or all of such share of principal or income by virtue of any order, assignment, or transfer executed by

such beneficiary, and the interest or interests of any such beneficiary therein or in any part thereof shall not be liable for such beneficiary's debts or subject to garnishment, attachment, or other legal process, until actual distribution shall have been made thereof to such beneficiary under this trust, by the trustee.

FIFTH:- I hereby appoint my wife, Jessie M. Hallgren, of Rock Island, Illinois, executrix of this my Last Will and Testament and request that she be permitted to serve without bond, and I hereby authorize and empower her, as such executrix, to sell, transfer, and convey any or all of the personal property of which I may die seized or possessed, at public or private sale, for the payment of my debts or the proper administration of my estate, at such places and on such terms and at such times as she may deem best, and to settle and compromise, in her discretion, any agreements, claims, or demands which I may have against any person or corporation, on such terms as she may deem advisable.
