

Last Will and Testament

I, DR. T. H. GRESHAM of Madison County, Mississippi, being over the age of twenty-one years and of sound and disposing mind and memory, do hereby make, publish and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament, as follows:

ITEM I. I direct that my Executor pay all of my just debts probated against my estate, and all funeral expenses as soon after my death as can be conveniently done.

ITEM II. I direct that my home situated on my farm in Madison County, Mississippi, near the Natches Trace (along with one acre of land upon which said home is situated to be selected by my wife, Mrs. Aubrey Kilcrease Gresham), to be set aside as a home for my wife, Mrs. Aubrey Kilcrease Gresham, so long as she lives, does not remarry and uses said home for her home.

If at any time during the lifetime of my said wife she decides not to use said home as her home, or in the event she remarries, then in such event or events said home shall be sold, and out of the proceeds received therefrom Twenty Five Hundred Dollars in cash shall be first given to my said wife, Mrs. Aubrey Kilcrease Gresham, and the balance of the proceeds received therefrom shall be equally divided between my wife, Mrs. Aubrey Kilcrease Gresham, and my four children, to-wit: Ethel Stubblefield, Erline Gresham, Nita Pearl Musclevwhite and William A. Gresham, share and share alike.

ITEM III. I further direct that out of the cash and stocks which I own at the time of my death, the expenses of my last illness and funeral be first paid, and then the sum of Five Thousand Dollars be paid to my wife, Mrs. Aubrey Kilcrease Gresham, if there remain sufficient cash or stocks to so pay; and any amount of cash or stocks over and above the said sickness or funeral

expenses and the said Five Thousand Dollars shall be equally divided between my aforementioned four children, share and share alike.

ITEM IV. I give, devise and bequeath all of the household furniture, fixtures and incidentals of housekeeping to my wife, Mrs. Aubrey Kilcrease Gresham.

ITEM V. I give, devise and bequeath unto my wife, Mrs. Aubrey Kilcrease Gresham, her choice of such automobiles as I may own at the time of my death in the event I own more than one automobile, or in the event I own only one automobile, then she shall have said automobile as her own personal property.

ITEM VI. I give, devise and bequeath unto my daughter, Erline Gresham, the right to use as a home for herself as long as she lives, or as she desires to occupy the same as a home, that certain house and lot designated as 133 Columbia Avenue, Jackson, Mississippi, with remainder over to my wife, Mrs. Aubrey Kilcrease Gresham, and my four said children, share and share alike.

ITEM VII. I further give, devise and bequeath that the farm equipment owned by me at the time of my death and all other land or property not herein specifically devised, shall go equally to my wife, Mrs. Aubrey Kilcrease Gresham, and to my four children, share and share alike. It is my desire that my wife and my children, devisees herein, agree upon a division or sale of the property left jointly to them (with the exception of Item VI.), but in the event they are unable to agree as to a division thereof within a period of three years from the date of my death, then in this event I direct that the Chancery Court appoint a Commissioner to so divide said property or to sell the same and divide the proceeds according to this Will. However, if in the opinion of the Chancery Court additional time should be allowed on account of some national emergency or depression, or that a fair market value could not be obtained for said property, then the Court shall in its discretion extend

said time of sale or division as the Court should deem expedient, but not to exceed ten years from the date of my death. Division of property set forth in Item VI. shall be made when the life estate therein bequeathed shall be terminated or abandoned, and is subject to the rights of third parties therein vested.

ITEM VIII. I further provide that in the event any one of the five aforementioned devisees should predecease me in death and have surviving them children, then in such event their said share shall go to the surviving children of said devisees, but if such predeceased devisee leaves no children surviving them, then in such event the share that would have gone to said devisee shall go to the remaining surviving devisees herein mentioned, share and share alike.

ITEM IX. I hereby nominate, appoint and constitute my son, William A. Gresham, Executor of this my Last Will and Testament.
