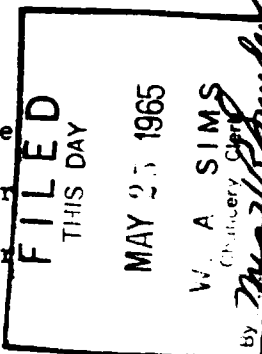
LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF JAMES VICTOR SMITH

that capacity, and that she not be required to account to anyone or any court in that capacity.

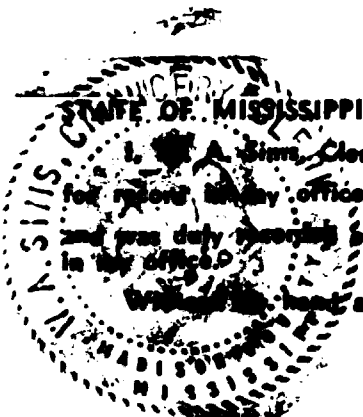

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT
