Quick Notes from the Madison County Board of Supervisors Meeting, 10/7/19

- The Madison County Board of Supervisors (the Board) approved a Resolution Of Intent to issue \$8.4 million in long-term bonds for new construction and upgrades to old construction.
- The Board also approved a Resolution of Intent to issue short-term notes, not to exceed \$5.5 million, for projects such as paving, building new roads, and drainage.
- The Board approved making a request to St. Dominic's for the donation of two parcels for the right-of-way for Reunion Three.
- Tax Collector Kay Pace presented Madison County company Ion, who specializes in kiosks, to discuss using them in safe, secure and needed areas of the county to decrease the lines for taxpayers to pay property taxes, car tags, etc. The Board supported the concept and requested some additional information.
- The Board approved renting three trucks for Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Election Week to move the voting machines to and from the precincts. The budgeted cost will be approximately \$9,000.
- The Board approved the final plat for Whisper Ridge.
- Please note the Board will host a groundbreaking at Sulphur Springs Park this Thursday, October 10, 2019, at 10:00 a.m. The groundbreaking is located at the intersection of Sulphur Springs Road and Highway 17, near Camden.
