Quick Notes: The Madison County Board of Supervisors Meeting, April 6, 2020

- The Madison County Board of Supervisors (the Board) voted for the following steps to be taken regarding Madison County Government-related meetings to be in compliance with Federal guidelines and Madison County's Emergency Declaration related to the COVID-19 virus:
 - Attendance at board meetings will be limited to 10 people (Members of the Board of Supervisors, the Chancery Clerk, the Sheriff, the Board Attorney, the County Administrator and the Comptroller).
 - Presenters that are on the agenda will be staged in the Board Conference Room to provide a healthy distance between presenters.
 - A Supervisor may add someone to the agenda, and this presenter will be staged in the Board Conference Room, as well.
 - Handouts must be submitted in advance of the board meeting for appropriate distribution.
 - Presenters will be asked to enter the Boardroom at the time their business item is called for consideration. Following their presentation, in an attempt to keep the board room to 10 people, presenters will be asked to exit the Boardroom.
 - Citizens who have business with the Board, will be asked to wait outside of the Boardroom and will be notified when they come-up on the agenda.

The guidelines may also apply to other meetings, such as Planning and Zoning, until further notice.

- In addition, the Board heard an update on the following items regarding the COVID-19 virus:
 - If a taxpayer has government-related business and needs to visit with an employee, they are requested to make an appointment, use email, the telephone or visit our website, www.madison-co.gov.
 - The Board was advised that the volume of garbage has increased by 50 percent. To that end, Waste Management is continuing with its established schedule but if garbage is not picked up on the regular pick-up day, it will be picked-up the next business day.

- Although Madison County parks are open so citizens can use the walking trails, the children's play equipment will be taped-off to help prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- Household Hazardous Waste Day has been postponed until further notice.
- In order to be in Federal and County compliance, the Sherriff's Office has postponed the April Community Advisory Board, as stated on the Sheriff's website, <u>www.sheriffrandytucker.com</u>. When the next meeting is scheduled it will be announced on the same website.
- The Board approved the purchase of in-car video equipment for 21 pursuit vehicles for the Sheriff's office.
- The Board approved \$427,000 to overlay Kearney Park Road to Livingston Vernon Road.
- The Board approved \$18,077 to add Charlton Drive to the 2020 Road Plan.
- The Board approved \$309,500 to add Gus Green Road to the 2020 Road Plan.
- The Board approved an Interlocal Agreement between Madison County and the Town of Flora for overlay of Kearney Park Road, in the town of Flora. This is a project that is partially funded by the Metropolitan Planning Organizataion.
- Planning and Zoning voted to allow *The Range* an additional 58.63 square feet of signage and the Board approved.
