

Madison County Board of Supervisors Meeting, October 5, 2020: Quick Notes

- The Madison County Board of Supervisors (the Board) voted to place a complimentary ad in the newspaper to thank Madison County's more than 5,000 veterans for their service, sacrifice, and patriotism. Veteran's Day is November 11, 2020.
- The Board approved a site plan amendment for Dees Office Building in the Gluckstadt Commercial Center, which is on the corner of Dees Plaza and Dees Drive.
- The Board approved a preliminary plat for a new residential development, Glendale Farms.
- The Board approved a contract with H&M Construction Company for \$562,046 for the Oakfield Boulevard Drainage Improvements Project.
- The Board approved a contract with Hemphill Construction for \$340,562 for the Yandell Road Drainage Improvements Project.
- The Board approved an engineering contract with Garver for \$44,943 for construction, engineering, and inspection services for the Oakfield Boulevard Drainage Improvements Project.
- The Board approved a \$29,851.17 contract with Mendrop Engineering Resources for construction, engineering, and inspection services for the Yandell Road Drainage Improvements Project.
- At the request of the City of Canton, the Board authorized the Road Department to repave the portion of Green Acres Drive that approaches the railroad tracks for approximately \$3,000.
- The Board approved \$1,026 for the acquisition of a right-of-way on King Ranch Road.
- The Board approved \$100 for the acquisition of right-of-way for the Way Road Project.
- The Board approved \$100 for the acquisition of a temporary and permanent easement adjacent to Way Road for the Way Road Drainage Project.
- The Board approved \$46,571 for the acquisition of right-of-way for the Bozeman Road Improvements Project.
- County Administrator Shelton Vance advised the Board that the Census ended on September 30, 2020, the numbers as of October 2, 2020, indicate that Madison County will rank a strong number two in Mississippi with 71.9 percent participation while DeSoto County will rank number one in Mississippi with 72.5 percent participation. Madison County exceeded Mississippi's participation rate of 60 percent and the nation's participation rate of 66.6 percent rate, as of the above date.
