

Madison County Board of Supervisors Meeting Quick Notes: June 17, 2024

- The Madison County Board of Supervisors, “the Board,” was advised that the Broadband Expansion and Accessibility of Mississippi Office (BEAM) will provide the full amount requested, \$4.9mm, for the \$17mm broadband project that will impact more than 4,000 homes in Northeast Madison County. Additional funds will come from Comcast (\$7mm) and from the County’s ARPA funds (\$5mm).
- Following a public hearing with no public opposition, the Board approved a resolution authorizing and directing the issuance of the first set of bonds for the Madison County Capacity Improvement Plan for \$19mm which can only be used to repair and widen Stribling Road, Weisenberger Road, Yandell Road, West County Line Road, Wheatley Street, Reunion Parkway, Bozeman Road, and Catlett Road, as well as renovations to the Madison County Circuit Courthouse
- At the request of Supervisor Karl M. Banks, the Board reappointed Joyce Monroe and Scott Colson to the West Madison Utility District Board.
- The Board granted a tax exemption for a parcel of land owned by Old Town Wesley Church.
- The Board approved relocating the Ridgecrest Baptist Church Polling Place to the Madison Community Center. The Madison County Circuit Clerk will let voters know if they are impacted.
- The Board approved a contract with the Central Mississippi Planning and Development District (CMPDD) for grant administration for the Community Development Block Grant which will repair and rehabilitate sewer lines near Kearney Park.
- The Board approved Fire Protection Service Agreements between the County and the Valley View Fire District, the Town of Flora, the Southwest Madison County Fire District, the Kearney Park Fire District, the Farmhaven Fire District, the South Madison County Fire Protection District, the Camden Fire Protection District, the Central Madison County Fire Protection District, to allow fire-fighting equipment to enhance fire services.
- The Board awarded Wynn Landscape Services, the lowest bidder, a \$48,020 contract for landscaping county buildings.
- At the request of Sheriff Randy Tucker, the Board accepted a \$14,000 donation from the Presto Foundation to provide a light tower to assist during emergencies.
