In the Matter of the Continuation of a Petition to Rezone Certain Property by Richard Skinner

ORDINANCE BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF MADISON COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, AMENDING THE MADISON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors did previously take up the petition filed by Richard Skinner seeking the rezoning of certain property in Madison County on Friday, May 16, 2003 pursuant to an advertisement for said public hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors did take up said matter on May 16, 2003 at 10:00 A.M. as advertised and conducted a public hearing thereon and thereafter continued this matter until May 23, 2003 at 10:00 A.M.; and

WHEREAS, Richard Skinner, did file an Application to rezone certain property from its present SU-1 Special Use District Classification to a R-2 Residential Use District Classification; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution properly adopted by the Board of Supervisors on the 11th day of April, 2003, a hearing was set for the 16th day of May, 2003, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., and the Clerk did cause Notice of said hearing to be published in the <u>Madison County Herald</u>, a newspaper published and of general circulation in Madison County, Mississippi, in the manner and for the time required by law; and

WHEREAS, the hour of 10:00 o'clock a.m. on the 16th day of May, 2003, did arrive and the Board of Supervisors conducted said public hearing and then continued this matter until 10:00 o'clock a.m. on the 23rd day of May, 2003; and

WHEREAS, the hour of 10:00 o'clock a.m. on the 23rd day of May, 2003 did arrive an

WHEREAS, there were no objections; and

WHEREAS, the matter was presented to the Board of Supervisors and after discussion thereof Supervisor W.T. "Bill" Banks offered the following Ordinance and moved that it be continued, to wit:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF MADISON COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS, TO WIT:

1. That the following described tract of real property be, and the same is hereby, rezoned from its present SU-1 Special Use District Classification to R-2 Residential Use District Classification, to wit:

Commence at the SE corner of the W½ of the E½ of said Section 30 and run thence N 00 degrees 01 minutes 04 seconds East for a distance of 5,311.11 feet along the mid-line of the said E ½ of Section 30 to an iron pin which marks the southern right-of-way line of Gluckstadt Road; and also marks the Point of Beginning for the parcel herein described; thence S 00 degrees 01 minutes 04 seconds W for a distance of 3,430.66 feet along the said mid-line of the E½ of Section 30; thence leave said mid-line and run N 66 degrees 20 minutes 02 seconds W for a distance of 663.84 feet; thence N 26 degrees 54 minutes 26 seconds W for a distance of 833.58 feet; thence N 02 degrees 54 minutes 07 seconds W for a distance of 155.83 feet; thence N 39 degrees 11 minutes 33 seconds W for a distance of 566.36 feet; thence N 13 degrees 24 minutes 04 seconds W for a distance of 153.00 feet; thence N 31 degrees 20 minutes 00 seconds W for a distance of 488.61 feet to the eastern right-of-way line of Bozeman Road; thence N 37 degrees 43 minutes 51 seconds E for a distance of 109.19 feet along the said eastern right-of-way line; thence run 305.08 feet along the arc of a 1,135.41 foot radius curve to the left along the said eastern right-ofway line said arc having a 304.16 foot chord which bears N 30 degrees 02

minutes 00 seconds E; thence run 489.24 feet along the arc of a 1,260.72 foot radius curve to the left along the said eastern right-of-way line, said arc having a 486.18 foot chord which bears N 11 degrees 13 minutes 07 seconds E; thence N 00 degrees 06 minutes 04 seconds E for a distance of 284.76 feet along the said eastern right-of-way line of Bozeman Road; thence N 53 degrees 42 minutes 29 seconds E for a distance of 258.55 feet along a right-of-way flare to the said southern right-of-way line of Gluckstadt Road; thence S 89 degrees 53 minutes 06 seconds E for a distance of 563.99 feet along the said southern right-of-way line; thence S 89 degrees 22 minutes 36 seconds E for a distance of 203.80 feet along the said southern right-of-way line; thence S 89 degrees 48 minutes 16 seconds E for a distance of 297.02 feet along the said southern right-of-way line; thence N 89 degrees 44 minutes 19 seconds E for a distance of 54.56 feet along the said southern right-of-way line of Gluckstadt Road to the Point of Beginning, containing 90 acres, more or less.

That the Madison County Zoning Ordinance be and the Zoning District Map be and the same are hereby amended so as to reflect the foregoing change in the zoning of the above described real property.

In the Matter of Requesting the 28th Advance Under an Existing Loan Agreement dated March 6, 2001

The Board of Supervisors of Madison County, Mississippi (the "County") acting for and on behalf of the County, took up for consideration the matter of requesting and authorizing a Twenty-Eighth advance under the loan between the Mississippi Development Bank and the County dated March 6, 2001. After a discussion of the subject, Supervisor Marc Sharpe offered and moved for the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF MADISON COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI (THE "COUNTY") AUTHORIZING A TWENTY-EIGHTH ADVANCE UNDER THAT CERTAIN LOAN AGREEMENT, DATED MARCH 6, 2001, BY AND BETWEEN THE MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT BANK AND THE COUNTY.

WHEREAS, through its Resolution dated February 23, 2001, the Board of Supervisors of the County approved a loan from the Mississippi Development Bank to the County in an amount not to exceed \$13,000,000 (the "Loan") pursuant to the terms and conditions of that certain Loan Agreement (the "Loan Agreement"), dated March 6, 2001, by and between the Mississippi Development Bank and the County;

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County now finds it necessary to approve the twenty-seventh advance under the Loan for the purpose of paying construction fees and expenses incurred in connection with the construction of the new County Jail/Sheriff complex and heating and air conditioning renovations for the Madison County Cultural Center (the "Project");

WHEREAS, pursuant to Mississippi Code §31-25-27, the County is authorized to request an advance under the Loan to raise money for the Project;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3.02 of the Loan Agreement, the minimum Request for Advance shall be in the amount of \$100,000;

WHEREAS, on April 13, 2001, the County received the first advance under the Loan in the amount of \$308,541;

WHEREAS, on June 15, 2001, the County received the second advance under the Loan in the amount of \$273,988;

WHEREAS, on July 18, 2001, the County received the third advance under the Loan in the amount of \$733,431.34;

WHEREAS, on July 25, 2001, the County received the fourth advance under the Loan in the amount of \$800,000;

WHEREAS, on September 5, 2001, the County received the fifth advance under the Loan in the amount of \$396,890.71;

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2001, the County received the sixth advance under the Loan in the amount of \$522,574.12;

WHEREAS, on October 29, 2001, the County received the seventh advance under the Loan in the amount of \$374,670.43;

WHEREAS, on November 21, 2001, the County received the eighth advance under the Loan in the amount of \$356,998.69;

WHEREAS, on January 7, 2002, the County received the ninth advance under the Loan in the amount of \$262,926.02;

WHEREAS, on January 24, 2002, the County received the tenth advance under the Loan

- **WHEREAS**, on February 25, 2002, the County received the eleventh advance under the Loan in the amount of \$546,739.07.
- **WHEREAS**, on April 1, 2002, the County received the twelfth advance under the Loan in the amount of \$518,006.58.
- **WHEREAS**, on April 23, 2002, the County received the thirteenth advance under the Loan in the amount of Two Hundred Ninety-Seven Thousand Three Hundred Seventy-Seven and 68/100 Dollars (\$297,377.68).

- **WHEREAS**, on November 12, 2002, the County received the twenty-first advance under the Loan in the amount of Two Hundred One Thousand Two Hundred Forty-Nine and 99/100 Dollars (\$201,249.99).
- **WHEREAS**, on November 13, 2002, the County received the twenty-second advance under the Loan in the amount of One Hundred Sixty-Six Thousand Ninety-One and 30/100 Dollars (\$166,091.30).
- **WHEREAS**, on December 19, 2002, the County received the twenty-third advance under the Loan in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Five Hundred Forty-Eight and 75/100 Dollars (\$250,548.75).
- **WHEREAS**, on January 29, 2003, the County received the twenty-fourth advance under the Loan in the amount of One Hundred Ninety-One Thousand Two Hundred Fourteen and 60/100 Dollars (\$191,214.60).
- **WHEREAS**, on March 20, 2003, the County received the twenty-fifth advance under the Loan in the amount of One Hundred Forty-One Thousand Four Hundred Fifty-Eight and 81/100 Dollars (\$141,458.81).
 - WHEREAS, on April 14, 2003, the County received the twenty-sixth advance under the

Loan in the amount of Two Hundred Eight-Two Thousand One Hundred Seventy-One and 25/100 (\$282,171.25).

WHEREAS, on May 31, 2003, the County received the twenty-seventh advance under the Loan in the amount of Three Hundred Eighty-One Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty-Four and 25/100 Dollars (\$381,984.25).

WHEREAS, through its Resolution dated February 23, 2001, the Board of Supervisors of the County approved the substantial form of the Request for Advance to be used with each advance under the Loan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF MADISON COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI:

- **Section 1.** The Board of Supervisors of the County hereby finds that it is necessary and in the public interest to request an advance in the amount of One Hundred Ninety-Eight Thousand Eight Hundred Twenty-Five and 34/100Dollars (\$198,825.34) from the Loan to raise money for the Project.
- **Section 2.** The Board of Supervisors of the County hereby authorizes and approves the twenty-eighth advance under the Loan in the amount of One Hundred Ninety-Eight Thousand Eight Hundred Twenty-Five and 34/100Dollars (\$198,825.34) for the Project.
- **Section 3.** The President of the Board of Supervisors and the Chancery Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Request for Twenty-Eighth Advance on behalf of the County with such changes, completions, insertions and modifications as shall be approved by the officers executing same.
- **Section 4.** The disbursement by the Trustee of the Twenty-Eighth Advance to the County shall be noted on Schedule I of the Promissory Note. The repayment of the principal amount of the Twenty-Eighth Advance shall be payable in monthly installments which shall be set forth on Schedule II of the Promissory Note. The term for repayment of amounts advanced hereunder shall not exceed twenty-five (25) years.
- **Section 5.** The Board of Supervisors hereby directs the Chancery Clerk to deposit and/or credit the proceeds of this advance into the 2001 Mississippi Development Bank Pool Loan Fund created in connection with the Loan.
- **Section 6.** The Board of Supervisors authorizes and directs the Chancery Clerk to pay the invoice(s), submitted with the Request for Twenty-Eighth Advance, within five (5) business days of receipt of the funds.
- **Section 7.** The President of the Board of Supervisors and Chancery Clerk are hereby authorized and directed for and on behalf of the County to take any and all action as may be required by the County to carry out and give effect to the aforesaid documents authorized pursuant to this Resolution and to execute all papers, documents, certificates and other instruments that may be required for the carrying out of the authority conferred by this Resolution in order to evidence the authority.
- **Section 8.** The Board of Supervisors hereby approves the Schedule of Principal Installments, as set forth in **Exhibit A**, for the twenty-eighth advance under the Loan to be attached to the Promissory Note entered into by the County on March 6, 2001.
