WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors discovered that Mr. Courtney had a contract to purchase the property and was not the owner of the structure at issue; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors desire to approve the request of Mr. Courtney for the special exception provided that the owner of the dilapidated structure was contacted and requested to remove said dilapidated structure; and

- 1. That Sidney Courtney be allowed and granted a special exception for 3 years to place a mobile home in an R-1 Residential District on property leased by Mr. Courtney in Madison County, Mississippi and described as Parcel #95D-19-021 according to the tax records of Madison County.
- 2. The Board of Supervisors does hereby make the following findings certifying compliance with the specific rules governing this special exception and hereby finds that satisfactory provision and arrangement have been made concerning the following, to-wit:
  - a. - e. Screening and buffering, with reference to type, dimensions and character; the Board hereby finds that this is not an applicable requirement for this property.
- f. Signs, if any, and proposed exterior lighting, with reference to glare, traffic, safety, economic effect and compatibility in harmony to the properties in the district; the Board hereby finds that this is not applicable to this property and no requirement is made.
- g. Required yards and other open space; the Board hereby finds that setbacks and open space are readily available for said property.
- h. General compatibility with adjacent properties and other property in the district; the Board hereby finds that conditions for this property are generally compatible with adjacent properties and the conditions are acceptable except that the Zoning Administrator is hereby directed to contact the owner of the dilapidated structure on this property and to request that said dilapidated structure be removed as soon as possible.
