The Mannsdale-Livingston Heritage Preservation District Commission (MLHPD) held its regularly scheduled meeting on Monday, October 9, 2017, at 6:30pm at the Chapel of the Cross.

The Chapel of the Cross presented its proposal for a new sanctuary and support building. Amelia Barker, Chapel representative, Rev. Ben Robertson, Chuck Barlow and Brian Cabunac showed the Commission the plans for the additional buildings. Lighting is to comply with "dark sky" concept but be adequate for safety. Architects failed to include lighting plan, but subsequently provided written documentation of the lighting requirements that were discussed and agreed upon by all present at the meeting.

Additionally, specific exterior color choices that were discussed have been included in written form and are as follows: sanctuary trim - Monroe Bisque and sanctuary door - Country Redwood or dark stain, support building siding - Gloucester Sage, support building trim - Mesa Verde Tan or Shenandoah Taupe, possible support

building accent - Monticello Rose. All paint is Benjamin Moore. The exact brick has not been chosen yet but one that closely matches the existing buildings will be used and may be washed. Shingles will be similar to Grand Manor.

The additional buildings will use the same ingress and egress as the existing buildings. Parking will be gravel like current parking for the existing buildings.

The Chapel of the Cross members will do the landscaping and are researching options to match the longstanding existing plants. Therefore, there is no landscaping plan included with the presentation. Notations have been made showing that disturbed areas will be restored to natural when buildings are completed. The Chapel will come back before the county with their landscaping plan for approval before it is implemented.

Preliminary grading and drainage are shown, but the engineer stamped final copy was not yet available and is not included in our set of signed documents. Petitioners are aware that the final copy must be submitted to the county for review by the County Engineer.

MLHPD voted to unanimously approve this project conditional upon lighting plan, paint samples, brick, and landscaping notes being supplied in accordance with
