ORDER APPOINTING JUVENILE DRUG COURT ATTORNEYS

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2023, attorney Joshua Coe, is hereby appointed as Public Defender for the Madison County Juvenile Drug Court. Such appointment requires the attendance of Joshua Coe at each session of Drug Court in Madison County and representation of juveniles at regular scheduled hearings, sanction hearings, staff meetings, and other matters to be considered by the Court. For such services Joshua Coe will be compensated the sum of \$833.33 per month to be paid from the JAG grant Fund #190-172. His PERS, Worker's Compensation and FICA associated with his salary shall also be paid from Fund 190-172. This compensation is in separate and apart from his salary as Youth Court Defense Counsel and Guardian Ad Litem in Youth Court.

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2023, attorney Lindsey Herr, is hereby appointed as Prosecutor for the Madison County Juvenile Drug Court. Such appointment requires the attendance of Lindsey Herr at each session of Drug Court in Madison County and regular scheduled hearings, sanction hearings, staff meetings, and other matters to be considered by the Court. For such services Lindsey Herr will be compensated the sum of \$833.33 per month to be paid from the JAG grant Fund #190-172. Her PERS, Worker's Compensation and FICA associated with her salary shall also be paid from Fund 190-172. This compensation is in separate and apart from her salary as Youth Court Prosecutor in Youth Court.
