SENATE BILL NO. 2353 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 23-15-227 AND 23-15-229, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM COMPENSATION POLL WORKERS AND BALLOT CARRIERS CAN RECEIVE ON ELECTION DAY; TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-239, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW LOCAL GOVERNING 5 AUTHORITIES TO PROVIDE ANY FAIR AND REASONABLE VALUE OF COMPENSATION THAT SURPASSES THE FEDERAL HOURLY MINIMUM WAGE TO 7 POLL WORKERS FOR ATTENDING REQUIRED TRAINING; AND FOR RELATED 8 PURPOSES. 9

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 10 SECTION 1. Section 23-15-227, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 11
- 12 23-15-227. (1) [Effective July 1, 2023 to December 31,
- 13 2023]. The poll managers shall be each entitled to Seventy-five
- 14 Dollars (\$75.00) for each election; however, the board of
- supervisors may, in its discretion, pay the poll managers an 15
- 16 additional amount not to exceed * * * One Hundred Twenty-five
- 17 Dollars (\$125.00) per election.
- * * * [Effective from and after January 1, 2024]. The poll 18
- 19 managers shall be each entitled to One Hundred Twenty-five Dollars
- 20 (\$125.00) for each election; however, the board of supervisors

- 21 may, in its discretion, pay the poll managers an additional amount
- 22 not to exceed Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per election.
- (* * *2) The poll manager who shall carry to the place of
- 24 voting, away from the courthouse, the official ballots, ballot
- 25 boxes, pollbooks and other necessities, shall be allowed * * * up
- 26 to Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for each voting precinct for so
- 27 doing. The poll manager who acts as returning officer shall be
- 28 allowed * * * up to Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for each voting
- 29 precinct for that service. If a person who performs the duties
- 30 described in this subsection uses a privately owned motor vehicle
- 31 to perform them, he or she shall receive for each mile actually
- 32 and necessarily traveled in excess of ten (10) miles, the mileage
- 33 reimbursement rate allowable to federal employees for the use of a
- 34 privately owned vehicle while on official travel.
- 35 (* * *3) The compensation authorized in this section shall
- 36 be allowed by the board of supervisors, and shall be payable out
- 37 of the county treasury * * *.
- 38 (\star \star 4) The compensation provided in this section shall
- 39 constitute payment in full for the services rendered by the
- 40 persons named for any election, whether there be one (1) election
- 41 or issue voted upon, or more than one (1) election or issue voted
- 42 upon at the same time.
- (* * *5) The Secretary of State shall promulgate rules and
- 44 regulations as are necessary to ensure the safety of poll
- 45 managers, election commissioners, electors and their families at

- 46 the voting precincts during a COVID-19 public health risk or other
- 47 public health risk declared by the Governor where the appearance
- 48 of such persons may result in exposure to such risk or the
- 49 exposure of other persons to such risk.
- SECTION 2. Section 23-15-229, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 51 amended as follows:
- 52 23-15-229. The compensation for poll managers and other
- 53 workers in the polling places of a municipality shall be the same
- 54 as the compensation paid by the county for those services;
- 55 provided, however, that the governing authorities of a
- 56 municipality shall not be required to pay any additional
- 57 compensation authorized by the board of supervisors. The
- 58 governing authorities of a municipality may, in their discretion,
- 59 pay clerks and poll managers in the polling places of the
- 60 municipality an additional amount of compensation not to
- 61 exceed * * * Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per election * * *.
- 62 Such compensation shall be payable out of the * * * municipal
- 63 general fund * * *.
- SECTION 3. Section 23-15-239, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 65 amended as follows:
- 66 23-15-239. (1) The executive committee of each county, in
- 67 the case of a primary election, or the election commissioners of
- 68 each county, in the case of all other elections, in conjunction
- 69 with the circuit clerk, shall, in the years in which counties
- 70 conduct an election, sponsor and conduct, not less than five (5)

71 days before each election, not less than four (4) hours and not 72 more than eight (8) hours of poll manager training to instruct 73 poll managers as to their duties in the proper administration of 74 the election and the operation of the polling place. Any poll 75 manager who completes the online training course provided by the 76 Secretary of State shall only be required to complete two (2) 77 hours of in-person poll manager training. No poll manager shall 78 serve in any election unless he or she has received these 79 instructions once during the twelve (12) months immediately 80 preceding the date upon which the election is held; however, 81 nothing in this section shall prevent the appointment of an 82 alternate poll manager to fill a vacancy in case of an emergency. 83 The county executive committee or the election commissioners, as appropriate, shall train a sufficient number of alternates to 84 85 serve in the event a poll manager is unable to serve for any 86 reason.

(2) (a) If it is eligible under Section 23-15-266, the county executive committee may enter into a written agreement with the circuit clerk or the county election commission authorizing the circuit clerk or the county election commission to perform any of the duties required of the county executive committee pursuant to this section. Any agreement entered into pursuant to this subsection shall be signed by the chair of the county executive committee and the circuit clerk or the chair of the county election commission, as appropriate. The county executive

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- ommittee shall notify the state executive committee and the Secretary of State of the existence of the agreement.
- 98 If it is eligible under Section 23-15-266, the municipal executive committee may enter into a written agreement 99 100 with the municipal clerk or the municipal election commission 101 authorizing the municipal clerk or the municipal election 102 commission to perform any of the duties required of the municipal 103 executive committee pursuant to this section. Any agreement 104 entered into pursuant to this subsection shall be signed by the 105 chair of the municipal executive committee and the municipal clerk 106 or the chair of the municipal election commission, as appropriate. 107 The municipal executive committee shall notify the state executive 108 committee and the Secretary of State of the existence of the 109 agreement.
 - (3) The board of supervisors and the municipal governing authority, in their discretion, may compensate poll managers who attend these training sessions. The compensation shall be at a rate of not less than the federal hourly minimum wage * * * and not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per hour. Poll managers shall not be compensated for more than sixteen (16) hours of attendance at the training sessions regardless of the actual amount of time that they attended the training sessions.
- 118 (4) The time and location of the training sessions required 119 pursuant to this section shall be announced to the general public 120 by posting a notice thereof at the courthouse and by delivering a

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- 121 copy of the notice to the office of a newspaper having general
- 122 circulation in the county five (5) days before the date upon which
- 123 the training session is to be conducted. Persons who will serve
- 124 as poll watchers for candidates and political parties, as well as
- 125 members of the general public, shall be allowed to attend the
- 126 sessions.
- 127 (5) Subject to the following annual limitations, the
- 128 election commissioners shall be entitled to receive a per diem in
- 129 the amount of * * * One Hundred Ten Dollars (\$110.00), to be paid
- 130 from the county general fund, for every day or period of no less
- 131 than five (5) hours accumulated over two (2) or more days actually
- 132 employed in the performance of their duties for the necessary time
- 133 spent in conducting training sessions as required by this section:
- 134 (a) In counties having less than fifteen thousand
- 135 (15,000) residents according to the latest federal decennial
- 136 census, not more than five (5) days per year;
- 137 (b) In counties having fifteen thousand (15,000)
- 138 residents according to the latest federal decennial census but
- 139 less than thirty thousand (30,000) residents according to the
- 140 latest federal decennial census, not more than eight (8) days per
- 141 year;
- 142 (c) In counties having thirty thousand (30,000)
- 143 residents according to the latest federal decennial census but
- 144 less than seventy thousand (70,000) residents according to the

145	latest	federal	decennial	census,	not	more	than	ten	(10)	days	per
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- 146 year;
- 147 (d) In counties having seventy thousand (70,000)
- 148 residents according to the latest federal decennial census but
- 149 less than ninety thousand (90,000) residents according to the
- 150 latest federal decennial census, not more than twelve (12) days
- 151 per year;
- (e) In counties having ninety thousand (90,000)
- 153 residents according to the latest federal decennial census but
- 154 less than one hundred seventy thousand (170,000) residents
- 155 according to the latest federal decennial census, not more than
- 156 fifteen (15) days per year;
- 157 (f) In counties having one hundred seventy thousand
- 158 (170,000) residents according to the latest federal decennial
- 159 census but less than two hundred thousand (200,000) residents
- 160 according to the latest federal decennial census, not more than
- 161 eighteen (18) days per year;
- 162 (g) In counties having two hundred thousand (200,000)
- 163 residents according to the latest federal decennial census but
- 164 less than two hundred twenty-five thousand (225,000) residents
- 165 according to the latest federal decennial census, not more than
- 166 nineteen (19) days per year;
- 167 (h) In counties having two hundred twenty-five thousand
- 168 (225,000) residents or more according to the latest federal
- 169 decennial census, not more than twenty-two (22) days per year.

170	(6) Election commissioners shall claim the per diem
171	authorized in subsection (5) of this section in the manner
172	provided for in Section 23-15-153(6).

- (7) (a) To provide poll manager training, the Secretary of
 State has developed a single, comprehensive poll manager training
 program to ensure uniform, secure elections throughout the state.

 The program includes online training on all state and federal
 election laws and procedures and voting machine opening and
 closing procedures.
- (b) County poll managers who individually access and complete the online training program, including all skills assessments, at least five (5) days before an election shall be defined as "certified poll managers," and entitled to a "Certificate of Completion."
- (c) At least one (1) certified poll manager shall be appointed by the county election officials to work in each polling place in the county during each general election.
- 187 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 188 and after July 1, 2023.
