SUBJECT: Project Signs for Community Incentives

**Purpose:** To provide updated information for the project signs required by CID programs. Programs include CDBG, DIP, ARC, SMLPC, CAP and RAIL.

**Discussion:** Project signs shall be installed when construction or rehabilitation activity begins and shall remain in place throughout the project activity period. The sign shall be placed at the entrance of the project sight (Fire trucks are excluded from this requirement). Once the project is closed and a final monitoring is completed the project sign shall be removed. Please be advised that State funds may not be used for project sign expenditures.

The signs shall be weatherproof and shall have a background of red, white and blue in three segments. Examples of the signs can be found on our website at [www.mississippi.org](http://www.mississippi.org). Project signs shall include the following information as indicated in the attached examples:

- Program Name
  - Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
  - Development Infrastructure Program (DIP)
  - Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC)
  - Small Municipality and Limited Population Counties (SMLPC)
  - Capital Improvements Revolving Loan Program (CAP)
  - Freight Rail Revolving Loan Program (RAIL)
- Name of Recipient (City, Town, or County)
- Awarding Agency (Governor Tate Reeves, State of Mississippi, Mississippi Development Authority, William V. Cork, Executive Director)
- Local Official's
