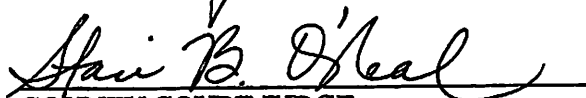
ORDER

THIS CAUSE came before the Court at the request of Mike Espy, Esq. on behalf of the Madison County Board of Supervisors. Mr. Espy has requested a clarification of the Order by this Court dated October 30, 2025 ("Order"). 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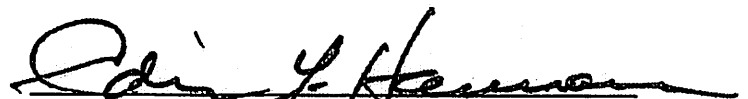
ORDER

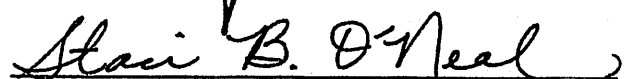
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THIS CAUSE came before the Court on motion *sua sponte*, and it appearing to the Court that loud and/or disruptive noises from construction occurring in Madison County Courthouse B are disrupting court proceedings, that the Court has requested the foreperson of the construction workers to abstain from such activities while Court is in session, that despite the Court's request, the foreperson has advised the Court that the County Administrator, Greg Higginbotham, has instructed the foreperson to disregard the Court's request and to continue such activities, that the Court has a duty to the public and the administration of justice to conduct its proceedings in a dignified and orderly fashion, that the construction activities described hereinabove are disruptive and interfere with the duties of the Court in conducting its business, that the schedule of each courtroom is available for advance planning should a request be made, the Court hereby **ORDERS** as follows:

1. All construction work shall cease immediately upon request by the Court on the basis that such activities are interfering with court proceedings.
2. Failure to comply with this Order shall result in an Order to Show Cause as to why the offending party should not be held in contempt of court for violating the terms of this Order.
