RESOLUTION OF THE MADISON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ENCOURAGING THE MISSISSIPPI LEGISLATURE TO CONSIDER THREE PRIORITY MATTERS FOR ADOPTION AND FUNDING DURING THE 2026 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

WHEREAS, over the last decade, Madison County, Mississippi has experienced population growth of more than 14.6%, with accompanying increases in its economic standing, and the heightening of its reputation as the preferred venue for high-performing schools, safe communities, and for the general well-being of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, over the same period, Madison County is often selected as the preferred location for expansion of large national and multi-national companies, including Amazon Web Services (AWS data centers), Amazon Fulfillment Center, United Parcel Service (UPS), and the Clark Beverage Group, among others; and

WHEREAS, as Madison County has experienced robust economic growth, it has also experienced negative impacts to its critical infrastructure, most particularly to its transportation systems- to its essential roads and bridges- which require considerable upgrades and improvements as traffic congestion continues to mount with each coming year; and

WHEREAS, the growing predominance of commercial trucks delivering to and from the Madison County Megasite alone serves as ample reason that the county must endeavor to continually seek funds to modernize its transportation system; and

WHEREAS, after due study and in consultation with traffic engineers, and in association with MCEDA and the Madison County Business League and Foundation, the Madison County Board of Supervisors has identified three (3) important projects that the 2026 Mississippi Legislature should be encouraged to consider, to-wit:

- 1. Weisenberger Road (expanding Weisenberger Road to a five-lane road between Parkway East and Highway 51 South).
- 2. Gluckstadt Road (expanding Gluckstadt Road to a four-lane road from Planters Row to just beyond Calhoun Station Parkway).
- 3. Commerce Park Connector Road (creating a road that will run along the north side of I-220 from Highland Colony Parkway to New Pointe Drive in Ridgeland).

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Madison County Board of Supervisors, in conjunction with the Madison County Business League and Foundation, shall present to

the Mississippi Legislature, convening in its 2026 legislative session, a list of three (3) projects for consideration for legislative enactment, support and funding, and said projects shall constitute the official legislative agenda that Madison County shall present for priority consideration by the 2026 Mississippi Legislature, to-wit:

- 1. Weisenberger Road.
- 2. Gluckstadt Road.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that after passage of the Resolution, a copy of same shall be made available to every member of the Madison County legislative delegation for their review and consideration, and that said members shall be encouraged to take all available means to gain approval and funding for the county's official legislative agenda.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the president of the board of supervisors shall affix his signature to the Resolution after passage of same.
