It appearing that certain invoices were presented to Madison County Board of Supervisors from Lyle Machinery Co., in the aggregate amount of \$4,354.61 for repair services that were rendered and delivered to an agency of the county, at the request of the county agency; and

It further appearing that said invoices of vendor were partially paid and the remainder of invoices in the amount of \$2,354.61 were denied and remain unpaid by the board of supervisors at the recommendation of the county comptroller due to the lack of an authorized purchase order being provided to vendor prior to delivery of said repair services; and

It further appearing that section 19-13-31 MS Code of 1972 (Annotated) authorizes the Court to order that payment be made to the vendor for products and services delivered

to the county in the absence of a purchase order and other similar documentation; and


It further appearing that Lyle Machinery Co., vendor in this matter, has agreed to the substance of this Complaint, has entered its Joinder to this Application and Complaint, has waived service of process through its authorized representative, and has agreed to the Form of the Order in this matter, and the Court having jurisdiction of the subject matter and of the parties is of the opinion that the claims should be paid.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED that the Madison County Board of Supervisors be and they are hereby authorized, empowered and ordered to pay the invoices and claims of Lyle Machinery Co., vendor in this matter, in the aggregate amount of \$2,354.61, as payment in full for services and products delivered in the absence of a lawful purchase order and that the clerk of the board of supervisors is hereby authorized and ordered to place said invoices upon the claims docket for payment by the Madison County Board of Supervisors.

JOINT COMPLAINT FOR DECLARATORY RELIEF

COMES NOW, Applicant Madison County, MS, by and through its counsel, and files this, their Joint Complaint for Declaratory Relief, and in support thereof, would show the following:

I.

Pursuant to Miss R. Civ. P., 57 (b)(1), Applicant Madison County, Mississippi requests that this Court make a judicial determination as to whether Joint Applicant, Lyle Machinery Company should receive payment from Madison County for equipment repair services delivered to the Madison County Road Department, the costs of which exceed Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) in the aggregate. Said repair was ordered by authorized agents of the Madison County Road Department and received by the county, but the transaction was accomplished without a valid purchase order and in such a manner as was contrary to state law and county purchasing policies, being violative of Section 31-7-103 MS Code of 1972 (Annotated.)

Complainant Madison County admits its error in this matter and wishes to pursue an immediate and lawful remedy by asking this Honorable Court, after due consideration, to enter an Order that authorizes Madison County to pay vendor, Lyle Machinery Company the sums that are due to it, being in the aggregate amount of \$2,354.61, as per the invoice herein attached as Exhibit "A" for services rendered.

II.

In the month of November 2024, Joint Complainant, Lyle Machinery Company provided repair services to certain heavy equipment owned by the Madison County Road Department. After delivery of the repair services, Joint Complainant properly invoiced Madison County in the amount of \$4,354.61 for the repair services.

III.

Despite proper action of Joint Complainant and in acknowledgement of its attempts to collect payment on the aforesaid invoices, Applicant Madison County has not fully paid the invoices because the invoice was more than the amount of \$2,000, and is believed to be violative of §31-7-103 MS Code of 1972 (Annotated) in that county governments are prohibited, unless exceptions apply, to expend public funds for services or products in which the acquisition costs constitute an amount more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) in the aggregate, without a valid purchase order approved by the Madison County Board of Supervisors, its purchase clerk, or designee. In this case, the repair services were performed without a purchase order.

IV.

On August 18th, 2025, at the recommendation of the county administrator, the board of supervisors officially denied payment of the invoice for the reasons stated herein, as shown on the official minutes attached hereto at page 7, (Exhibit "B") and authorized counsel to pursue an Order from the Madison County Circuit Court, authorizing the county to pay the undisputed claims.

V.

The board of supervisors wishes to expedite the payment of the invoice without incurring further costs and expenses or subjecting vendor to extended periods without receiving payment for services delivered.

VI.


Lyle Machinery Company has joined in this petition as Joint Complainant by separate Joinder and Waiver of Process, being fully informed in the process. Complainant Madison County believes that the Joinder and approval of the vendor as Claimant in this action satisfies the statutory requisites of §19-13-31 of MS Code of 1972 (Annotated) Said Joinder and Waiver of Hearing is attached hereto as Exhibit "C."

VII.

Complaint Madison County respectfully requests that this Court make a judicial determination, after due consideration, and enter an Order thereby authorizing

Madison County to pay the invoice submitted by Lyle Machinery Company in the amount of \$2,354.61, and that the Comptroller of Madison County be authorized to enter this amount upon the official payment docket for full payment forthwith, upon the approval of the Madison County Board of Supervisors.





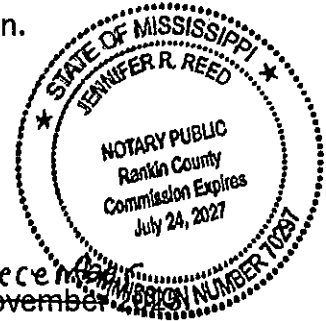
