





The Red Book (9th Edition) provides that the Center for Government and Community Development is to notify you annually of your Track II certification status within the legislatively-mandated Mississippi Education and Certification Program. Currently, in addition to being a certified appraiser, you hold the following two (2) advanced level of certification:

Assessment Evaluator I (AEI) Assessment Evaluator II (AEII)

According to Section 27-3-52 of the *Mississippi Code* which was adopted by the Legislature in 1980, you may now qualify for a \$2,000 annual financial bonus:

When any tax assessor and/or his deputies or assistants attend and successfully complete all qualifications pursuant to the Mississippi Education and Certification Program and receive the certification level of Track II, Evaluator I, they shall receive an additional One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) annually beginning the next fiscal year after completion.

... and receive the certification level of Track II, Evaluator II, they shall receive an additional One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) annually
