Project Summary/Abstract

The Madison County Citizens Services Agency (MCCSA), a public governmental agency, is proposing to continue to operate its 5311 Rural General Public Transportation Program serving the general public and the elderly/disabled populations in Madison County, MS. We are proposing to operate commuter work routes, flexible routes and demand response services Monday through Sunday, from 6:00 a.m. to 6:30p.m. We will provide extended evening demand response services on Saturdays until 9:00 p.m. Demand response services will be targeted to the general public as well as the elderly and persons with disabilities with a 24 hour advanced call in. We are proposing to operate eight (8) vehicles' with a 124 passenger capacity. MCCSA has (4) ADA accessible vehicles. We are requesting a total budget of \$472,732.00 of which \$268,875.00 in 5311 funds is requested, \$177,456.00 from Madison County Board of Supervisors and \$55,000.00 in contracts. This elderly/disabled daily call in demand services will be Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. Madison County Citizens Services Agency is proposing to provide approximately 18,000-21,000 passenger trips in 2014.

Goals and Objectives for 2012-2013 are:

1. Increase ridership above 2011-2012 program year 13,361 total trips were reported. We will increase ridership estimated trips for 2013 – 2014 will be 18,000-21,000 trips.

Objectives:

- A. We will initiate and provide a continuum of community awareness regarding transportation services. It will include the dissemination of brochures, routes, and schedules. This material will be distributed at employment sites, medical facilities, retail stores, Madison County WIN Job Center Partners, grocery stores and colleges, as well as other places of high general public concentration. This information will also be displayed at our (10) Bus Shelters across Madison County. We will advertise in newspapers and through radio public service announcements, on going.
- B. To implement the activities of our Marketing Plan weekly with businesses, agencies, schools, retails and hotels across Madison County to increase ridership, ongoing.
- C. To evaluate current routes regarding most accessible services to general public users, October, 2013.

- D. To continue to aggressively solicit program support funds from MDOT, RTAP, Contracts, and Memorandum of Understanding to enhance the MCCSA Transportation, ongoing.
- E. To discuss coordinated transportation services with all TRANSCON MDOT providers across the region to provide transportation services linkages, ongoing.

Need For Transportation Services

Madison County has a total population of 95,203 persons (2010 Census People Quickfacts). According to the 2010 Census Report, 10.8% of the population in Madison County is age 65 and over. According to Factfinder 2.Census.gov/faceshableservices/jsf/pages.xhtml, 9,342 (38.8%) of persons age 65 and over live with a disability. A total of 13.0% of the population in Madison County live below the poverty level. In Canton, Mississippi 28.6% of the population live in poverty. According to www.city-data.com/county-MS (17%) of the population in Madison County used some other means of transportation other than drove a car alone to work. Also, Factfinder 2, estimates that 1,525 workers by household in Madison County, Mississippi have no vehicle.

This data and census information suggest a desperate need for public transit services in Madison County. Also, this data implies that there is a targeted population that needs transportation services. Madison County Citizens Services Agency proposed to provide dependable affordable public transit services for the elderly, persons with disabilities and those in the Madison County area who need transportation services. MCCSA plans to provide 18,000-21,000 transportation trips in 2013-2014.

Expansion in Services as a result of ARRA Funds:

MCCSA received \$200,855 in ARRA funds for the purchase of (1) 17/21 ADA passenger bus, (1) 5/7 passenger van and 10 passenger shelters for the expansion of transportation services in Madison County. Transportation services have been expanded utilizing flexible routes for the (10) passenger shelters across Madison County in all V Districts. We have added (4) new flexible routes across Madison County. Reliable transportation services will be provided to impact accessibility to jobs and to address the personal transportation needs of citizens in Madison County, MS.
